

Why this book is offered as interactive PDF.

Ebooks are ePub or MOBI files that are specifically built for ereaders. The text in these are reflowable, and redistribute to fill the screen. Readers of these files can adjust font size, typeface, and other viewing options. Just like a web page, ebooks are based on HTML. Ebooks do not have page numbers, so do not reference them in the text. Instead they indicate with references like, "in the next section/chapter/ or at the end of the book." These books cannot be printed by the user. Ebooks are seen as the best file option for something with a great amount of text on an ereader, like a Kindle, a Nook, a Kobo reader, a tablet, an iPod, a phone, etc. Because screens can be small, viewing a PDF requires readers to zoom and navigate to read the content, by manually moving the page from left to right to read it all. An ebook, with its reflowable text, provides a much better reading experience. Most major ebook retailers do not allow you to upload a PDF.

A PDF is not a true ebook. Yes, they are electronic, and so are often thought of as an electronic "book," but they are designed to display a hard print-type document that has a fixed layout. So, PDFs will retain the page design and look the same no matter what device you view them on, from a tiny phone to a tablet or computer screen, where as an ebook will scramble the design. For this reason PDFs are excellent where a precise graphic design is required that incorporates complex graphics, images and text. However, when viewing enlarged content you will need to scroll across the screen. Also, while PDF file sizes are higher, they retain the quality of higher resolution files, offer interactively, sound files and video. Both formats are constantly under development. The ability to print from a PDF file can be enabled. This PDF file is print enabled which means a printed copy can be made from the PDF file.

WAVE - light - sound - is a series of volumes that present the photographs taken by Lloyd Godman of musicians, and gigs. The title plays on waves in both sound and light. The publications not only present his photographs from the late 1970 period and then the Womad experiences, but the transition from film to digital photography. Godman became interested in photography at an early age and went on to establish the photograph section at the Dunedin Art School which he was head of for 20 years before moving to Melbourne and teaching photography at RMIT. His approach has always asked questions of the medium.

Rarefaction: is the reduction of an item's density, the opposite of compression. Like compression, which can travel in waves, rarefaction waves also exist in nature as in sound waves. A common rarefaction wave is the area of low relative pressure following a shock wave.

Refraction: This bending of light ray, at the surface of separation of two media is called refraction.

Reflection: 1. Reflection is when light bounces off an object. If the surface is smooth and shiny, like glass, water or polished metal, the light will reflect at the same angle as it hit the surface.

Introduction - the refinement of digital

The photographs for Womad 2009 were shoot with a Fuji FinePix S3Pro 12mp camera mainly using a 70mm - 300mm f/4.0 - 5.6 Nikon Zoom lens. In 35mm or full fame terms, the lens when set to 300mm equates to 450mm.

During 2010 I upgraded the camera to a Canon 5D with a EF100-400mm f/4.5- 5.6L ISUSM lens

What is a Fluorite Lens?


The Basics:

Fluorite is a naturally occurring substance, which just so happens to possess near perfect light dispersion qualities. These qualities mean that they are a good choice for use in optical equipment,

for where ultra high quality is a must. For this reason, fluorite has been used in optical equipment, such as microscopes, since the 1920's.

A Little More Detail:

The only problem is that fluorite can not be harvested in sufficient quantity and quality in the natural environment. Canon's engineers found a way around this issue, by synthetically growing fluorite crystals in a laboratories. Even then, it is still a very complex job to turn Fluorite in to a lens product. For this reason, Fluorite lens elements are only found in the very best Canon lenses, such as the <u>EF 100-400mm F4-5.6 L USM II.</u>

The experience of taking these photographs was intense. Arriving early for the performance, I managed to get a spot against the rail. As the crowd gathered the physical pressure increased from a young audience. Beside me was a young girl who had the words CAT EMPIRE as a raised scar across her bare back. Someone made the comment how cool it was and she replied - " my friend scratched the words in with a nail and we put salt on the wound for days".

During the performance there was a crazy scramble that intensified where bodies were pushed and shoved so those behind could gain access to the front. There was more pressure in this mosh pit than any other performance I have photographed.



The Cholmondeleys were formed by Lea Anderson (now Artistic Director/Choreographer), Teresa Barker and Gaynor Coward in 1984 after they graduated from the Laban Centre for Movement and Dance. In 2011, both companies were reported to be disbanding at the end of the year, due to the loss of Arts Council grants.

Cost: The prints are offered at \$390 Au per print unframed plus postage and handling




